Know your way out: Al Mana college holds mock fire drill





A mock fire and evacuation drill involving students, staff and college officials was conducted on Tuesday, March 19 at Mohammed Al Mana College for Medical Sciences.

Prior to the mock fire drill, Engr. Hussein Alali, Safety Director of Al Mana General Hospital assisted by Mr. Niel Baquial, Safety Officer imparted insights on Fire Safety and Prevention as well as demonstrated the proper use of fire extinguisher held at the Pharmacy building auditorium.

A follow-up fire drill was conducted Sunday, March 24 to re-assess the preparedness of the college in times of emergency particularly in fire fighting and rescue operations. Time for evacuation was reduced from 13 minutes in the last fire drill to 5 minutes and 36 seconds which demonstrated the effectiveness of the workshop.

Must-know QA policies, procedures and events

As of January 2019, Mohammed Al Mana College for Medical Sciences has implemented a new policy pertaining to drafting, approving and publishing college policies under policy name "<u>Developing College Policies</u>". The policy is a cyclical process which begins at identifying a need to develop a certain policy and ends with monitoring and reviewing for the purpose of updating the drafted policy. It involves three major units who play essential roles in drafting, implementing and reviewing the policy such as the policy owner, Quality Committee and the College Council/Board of Trustees.

There have been about six (6) new policies recently drafted, approved and published anchored within the above mentioned policy. These new policies were drafted to provide important guidelines for employees. The policies contained in this section have been approved by the College Council for implementation with effectivity date mentioned in respective policies. By clicking the link (policy title), you will be redirected to the actual policy for your information and guidance. Note that, the link only works for stations linked at MACHS shared folders.

Academic Probation Policy V. 01

Purpose:

- (1) To establish a criteria and guideline in placing a student on academic probation.
- (2) To establish a criteria and guideline in dismissing a student after acquiring multiple academic probations.

Document Coding Policy V. 01

Purpose:

To categorize and organize the quality assurance documents for easy retrieval, control, internal audit purposes, and corrective and preventive actions using a unified coding system.

Student Attendance Policy V. 01

Purpose:

This document sets out the college's policy and expectations with regard to student attendance, attendance monitoring and absence from the class. It provides guidance for faculty and students, in order to ensure a consistent and informed approach regarding student attendance across the college.

Curriculum Development Policy V. 01

Purpose:

Curriculum development involves the effort of all the College members to create, sustain and improve the effectiveness of the academic study programs. It ensures that the learning and skills development will lead to appropriate proficiency and achievement levels.

Exam Moderation Policy V. 01

Purpose:

To ensure the accuracy of entering the grades into the final grade sheet.

Student Internal Transfer Policy V. 01

Purpose:

To establish the criteria and guidelines in approving and disapproving an internal transfer request from one program to the other within the college.
