Mrs. Nuzhat Banu, together with Mrs. Ethar Hassan Ghallab accompanied and supervised the students during the said industrial visit.




Students launch posters at Pharmacy Poster day



FILING MEDICAL EXCUSE

The student fills out a medical excuse form which can be found at the Infirmary Unit. Attach the sick leave report.

If notice is submitted, a letter is issued to the student to request for medical report from the hospital.

In case of absence during finals, a notice is sent to the instructor and advisor by the Examination Unit.

Copies of the medical excuse form and sick leave report are kept in the designated file at the Infirmary Unit.

After approval, Infirmary staff will send a copy of the approved form to the advisor, instructor and HOD.

The medical excuse form will be approved first at the Infirmary Unit followed by the Dean/Vice Dean for Academic Affairs.

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IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER:

Process your medical excuse request within 5 days of the absence for regular days and 2 days during exam period.
